Attendance was up to nearly the level before the pandemic. Our Next Gen youth program continues to grow and is the envy of museums across the country. This year we will be able to continue with the Hemming's Motor News Great Race program that will run from St. Augustine, FL to Colorado Springs, CO. We are also beginning a project for 2024 to attempt a world's land speed record run in the youth class at the Bonneville Salt Flats in a "belly tanker."

Repair and maintenance learning opportunities continue to grow and provide our youth with many unique hands-on experiences.

Our volunteer numbers continue to grow, as do the incredible services and projects they provide and complete here at the museum. Without their dedication of time, materials, and equipment, our museum would not survive. When you visit the museum, please be sure and thank a volunteer for their service.

Our collections continue to grow and diversify to meet the changing interests of our visitors of all ages. Most recent additions are in the model toy room. We have had an incredible IH model tractor donation made by Bill Berry. This display is located in the lower level and has several hundred pieces on display. We also received a large donation of Ertyl, Hot Wheels and Johnny Lightning prototypes from designer Mac Ragan. Many of these pieces are one-of-one and will only be found here at NATMUS. These are truly world class displays. I wish to thank Larry Gurtner, Betty Owens, and Travis Sprouse for putting these displays together. 

Last June, NATMUS and the Early Ford V-8 Museum teamed up to field two youth teams in the 2022 "Great Race" from Warwick, Rhode Island to Fargo, North Dakota. Gavin Swift, Jack Pontius, and John Taller, Jr., drove a 1941 Ford . John McCollough and Connor Miller drove a 1948 Ford. Kaden Goebel also traveled with them to help address any mechanical problems. Others helping out along the way were Don Monesmith, Nate Fluke, Alishia Iddings, Kennedy Pontius, and John Pontius.

The Great Race is an international event involving over 165 teams from around the world. It is a 9-day time-and-distance rally covering nearly 2500 miles..


Right away the youth teams were a big part of the race. They were in charge of tech inspection for all of the cars. They volunteered to rebuild a transmission on a 1932 Ford Model A the night before the race started. They made a wonderful name for themselves and were highly thought of by all the other participants. And they had a lot of fun — both teams scored aces (perfect times) during the race and performed admirably (62nd place for Swift/Pontius/Taller and 89th place for McCollough/Miller)! We are so proud of these young people!

Make sure to come out for as much of this fun event as you can attend, and show these race teams what "Hoosier Hospitality" is all about!


UPDATE: BELLY TANKER AND BONNEVILLE SALT FLATS
